Build a Deep Sea Tube Worm






What's the Big Idea?

Learn about the anatomy of a tube worm and its unique way of obtaining energy from the deep sea.

Instructions

Attach a feather (or fringe yarn) to one end of the pipe cleaner and thread the pipe cleaner through the straw. For a grouping of tube worms, attach several tube worms to the cardboard base using tape or a glue gun.





Supplies

- Large straws (ideally paper) or rolled paper for the tube
- Pipe cleaners for worm's body
- Feathers for plume
- Optional supplies: fringe yarn, masking tape (any color), cardboard discs or squares (to use as a base), construction paper, glue gun
